TEACHING EXPERIENCE AT ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

RECENT UNDERGRADUATE COURSES TAUGHT

Conflict and Negotiation: Explores the relationship between communication and conflict in a variety of personal and professional contexts. Provides students with a better understanding of their reactions to conflict and helps build the communication and analytical skills necessary to manage conflicts more effectively.

Introduction to Human Communication: This survey course introduces students to a variety of communication topics (e.g., verbal, nonverbal, identity, perceptions) and contexts (e.g., interpersonal, small group, organizational, mass, and intercultural), and helps students apply communication concepts to their personal and professional lives.

Persuasion and Social Influence: Identifies both classic and contemporary theories of persuasion, and helps students apply these theories to real-world situations. An emphasis is placed on judgment heuristics commonly relied upon by receivers when making decisions.

RECENT GRADUATE COURSES TAUGHT

Communication Research Methods: Identifying the merits and demerits of various communication research methods with an emphasis on measurement reliability and validity, surveys, experiments, and content analysis. Provides an advanced overview of the concepts, methods, and tools by which communication research is designed, conducted, interpreted, and critically evaluated.

Health Communication Campaigns: Provides an in-depth examination of key health communication theory and research, as well as the role of both theory and research in the design, implementation, and evaluation of health promotion and disease prevention interventions.

Persuasion: Provides an advanced analysis of the role communication plays in the persuasion process in various contexts. Different theoretical and practical approaches to the study of attitude and behavior change are discussed.

Survey Research: This one-credit method module provides an in-depth review of the concepts and tools by which survey research is designed, conducted, interpreted, and critically evaluated. A key focus of this class is on how to reduce both nonresponse and measurement error when conducting in-person and web-based self-report surveys.
