RESEARCH IN PROGRESS

“The Woman Clothed in the Sun: Spiritual Christianity on the Russian and American Frontiers, 1760-1960.” 372 typescript pages. This monograph explores the experience of Russian Spiritual Christians, whose spiritual vision of pacifism and human equality challenged the social hierarchies of both the Russian empire, where they originated, and the United States, where some of them eventually immigrated beginning in 1904. In both countries, the Spiritual Christians, who believed in the direct inspiration of the Holy Spirit, defied the inequalities of both American democracy and the Russian imperium. In Russia, the Spiritual Christians were persecuted and exiled for their religious beliefs; in the United States, they suffered for their commitment to pacifism and their unwillingness to register for the draft. By examining how Russian and American social categories of religion and race operated as tools of social control, this study sets in bold relief the ways that Russians and Americans understood their societies. It also tells an important and heroic story of ordinary people who, at great cost, remained true to their ideas of equality and peace.

“Heresy and the Making of Orthodoxy in Russia, 1700-1917.” 571 typescript pages. This dialogical history of religion in Russia argues that religious dissent significantly transformed the Orthodox church during the imperial period. The very effort to define heresy inevitably changed the definition of orthodoxy. Drawing on public and secret trials, missionary writings, and ethnographic works, this monograph explores charismatic, popular Orthodoxy. It also analyzes the ways that church elites responded to and tried to shape popular spirituality.

PERSONAL STATEMENT 2016

RESEARCH

My research program, focused on the significance of religion in Russia and the former USSR, seeks to integrate Eurasia into the broader scholarly conversation about religion. In the last three years, I completed eight peer-reviewed articles (three of which have been published) and four invited book chapters (two of which have appeared in print). Of the remaining seven articles, two are already in proofs and will be published this year in scholarly journals; two more are scheduled for publication in April and November of this year. In addition, I will soon submit an edited collection to Brepols. I am preparing a second edited collection and am completing my study of Spiritual Christianity in Russia, which I plan to submit later this year.

TEACHING

I chair the PhD committee of Shawn McAvoy, who is a tenure-track Assistant Professor of Religion at Patrick Henry Community College in Virginia. In 2016, Shawn received a \$5000 University Graduate Fellowship. I also serve on the PhD committees of Eric Breault, Joosil Kim, and Beverly Lucas. I chaired the BA honors thesis of Rachel Moses, who graduated in 2016, and of Katie Salmon, who will defend this April. I design my undergraduate courses to provide students opportunities to explore their own research questions, use databases effectively, discover sources, and evaluate scholarly literature. Students expressed appreciation for my helpful lectures, passion and accessibility, but some (especially in fall) complained that there was too much work and that I took too much time to grade their assignments. In fall, when I taught 100 students, the TA support I was originally assigned was taken away. I encouraged questions and provided feedback on every assignment. I continue to develop my skills as a teacher and am constantly seeking new exercises, readings, videos, and other resources to enhance my effectiveness.

In 2016, I became head of the religious studies faculty, an ex officio member of all RS committees, and a member of the SHPRS Excom. I advise the religious studies honors society, Theta Alpha Kappa. I am a member of the Melikian Center director search committee. I am also an affiliate of the Arizona Center for Medieval and Renaissance Studies, the Center for Jewish Studies, and the Center for the Study of Religion and Conflict. I am a member of the advisory board for the Grossman Jewish Studies lecture series. I advise three student organizations: Christian Challenge, Life among the Nations, and Intervarsity Christian Fellowship. On a national level, I serve as the vice-president/president-elect of the Association for the Study of Eastern Christian History and Culture (ASEC). This international organization of scholars is the most important professional organization in my subfield of Christianity in Eurasia. I helped to organize the seventh biennial conference, which will take place in March 2016. September 2015. I serve on the ASEC prize committee, as well as the Marc Raeff Prize Committee of the Eighteenth-Century Russian Studies Association.
