#### Executive Director & Chief Curator, Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art

SMoCA has an annual budget just under \$2 million, a staff of 10 core employees, and shares numerous services (development, marketing, finance, operations) with the parent organization of Scottsdale Arts. In my role as Executive Director I have increased admissions revenue 150% over five years, increased foundation, government, and corporate contributions by 135% (significant grants from The Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts, Institut Francais, National Endowment for the Arts, and Wells Fargo to name a few), developed museum-specific membership programs for cultivation (Member-only preview days, SMoCA in the Studio events), garnered international art world press (*Artforum, Art Papers*), national art world press (*Southwest Contemporary, Forbes, Visual Art Source, The Brooklyn Rail, Indian Country Today*), as well as significant local press (*NPR/KJZZ, Arizona Republic, Modern Luxury*), while positively weathering the ongoing pandemic without losing staff. When budgets decreased by 25%, I reshaped the exhibition schedule to maintain the highest exhibition standards with considerably less funding. Originated exhibitions with leading contemporary artists, such as Teresa Baker, Diedrick Brackens, Candice Breitz, Ana Teresa Fernandez, Carla Fernandez, Maria Hupfield, Brad Kahlhamer, Shizu Saldamando, Zineb Sedira, Phillip K. Smith III, Barbara Stauffacher Solomon, and Pedro Reyes to name a few.

Ensure programmatic excellence through workshops, artist talks, and special events. Developed free Second Saturday Family days that include family-friendly art making activities. Changed focus for Curator of Programming to Curator of Engagement and Digital Initiatives. Strengthened collaboration with Scottsdale Arts' Learning and Innovation department resulting in "Smart Space" activity space to accompany all exhibitions, in addition to enhanced gallery guides, as well as new programming for teens and older adults. Assure quality and efficacy of operations. Introduced online ticketing system, including advanced, timed tickets and developed and hired for a new position to lead visitor engagement (admissions, retail, and gallery attendees). Deepen and refine all aspects of communication from website and social media to press releases and emails, with the goal of strengthening the identity to resonate in both the local and international community.

Focus on diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility: renewed the mission statement in collaboration with staff and advisory council, introduced a land acknowledgement in the museum, instituted Spanish language translations for gallery didactics, and am currently working on handicapped accessible restrooms, in addition to a gender-free restroom. Over the last five years 60% of solo exhibitions featured Latinx or Indigenous artists and 90% featured BIPOC artists.

#### Curator of Contemporary Art, Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art

Worked with Director and Chief Curator to develop and implement original and innovative exhibitions and programming designed to bring diverse and engaged visitors to the museum. Secured funding to support two years of exhibitions from The Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts, in addition to funding from the Goldschmidt Foundation and Diane and Bruce Halle Foundation. Curated exhibitions with Guadalajara-based artist Luis Alfonso Villalobos and Mexico City-based artists Carla Fernandez and Pedro Reyes, as well as oversaw traveling exhibitions including *Marking the Infinite: Contemporary Women Artists from Aboriginal Australia* and solo exhibitions with Lydia Okumura and Belkis Ayón.

Provided services to artists that included grant writing, research, editing, and presentations. Clients included Randy Colosky, Desirée Holman, Margo Margewska, Gregory Sale, and Merav Tzar.

### October 2007-December 2012 Executive Director/Chief Curator, Museum of Craft and Folk Art, San Francisco

Worked with the Board of Directors to balance the budget and increase the visibility of the Museum through annual fundraisers and events. During tenure, experienced increases in attendance, board giving, general donations, foundation and government grants, as well as earned revenues, while decreasing expenses. Reconnected with museum founder, resulting in renewed interest and significant annual donations (\$150,000+). Received first time funding for the museum from Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts (\$80k over 2 years).

Responsible for the programmatic vision and financial strategies of every aspect of the Museum, including Exhibitions and Public Programs, the Education program, the Museum store, Marketing and the Development department. Developed, curated, and implemented a new museum program (exhibitions and events) that incorporated traditional crafts and folk art with contemporary artists in order to increase attendance and better connect with the local artist community. Partnered with e-commerce company, Etsy, to create a public program that broadened our audiences to include the "maker community." *Craft Bar* received much local press and I presented at American Alliance of Museums conference on the success of the program. Received *New York Times* press on exhibition with local artist Clare Rojas. Curated and oversaw exhibitions with artists such as Michael Arcega, Randy Colosky, Sister Corita, Harrell Fletcher, Clare Rojas, Eduoardo Sarabia, Bonnie Ora Sherk, Mike Shine, as well as a significant community collaborations with the Filipino Community Center and Creative Growth Arts Center, serving artists with intellectual and physical disabilities.

#### September 2004-October 2007 Assistant Director/Development Director, New Langton Arts, San Francisco

Worked with the Executive Director, Board of Directors, and staff to maintain the mission and vision of the organization, including curating exhibitions, producing public programs, as well as development activities such as grant writing, membership campaigns, and fundraising events. Organized, coordinated, and oversaw the annual benefit dinner and live art auction for three years. Supervised a staff of three: curatorial associate, gallery manager, and preparator.
