Note: Kobe College Corporation/Japan Education Exchange is a 100-year-old private (non-profit) foundation whose mission is to increase global awareness about Japan. It oversees five programs: (1) Internship program (bringing Japanese undergraduate students to short-term internship opportunities in the US); (2) Gottschalk English Teacher Program (sending 2 people from the US every 2 years to teach English at Kobe College Junior High School); (3) Bryant Drake Guest Professorship (sending 1 faculty person from anywhere in the world to Kobe College to teach their specialty); (4) Essay Contest, solicits essays from US High School students studying Japanese language; each year one student is selected to spend 6 weeks in Japan doing intensive language study along with a homestay; (5) Graduate Fellowship Program (funds 1 PhD Candidate from a US institution to conduct dissertation research in Japan; USD 30,000).

As Vice President of Programs, I oversee all five of KCCJEE programs. As a member of the Executive Committee, I plan the program budgets, manage and report to upper administrator regarding evaluation of programs.

As Chair of the Graduate Fellowship Committee (**2012-2019**), I updated/maintained application materials, advertise the Fellowship, and serve on the review committee which ultimately selects one application to fund. To date we have funded 19 PhD students to conduct their dissertation research in Japan. After the Fellowship year is complete, I often serve mentorship roles for Fellows as they begin to navigate their academic careers. Our Graduate Fellows have gone on to tenure track positions at Oxford, Ochanomizu University, Elon College, Vanderbilt University, New Jersey University, among others.

As Chair of the Bryant Drake Guest Professorship Committee (**2018~ongoing**), I coordinate with Kobe College (located in Japan) academic units to secure a candidate that serves their needs. I develop the advertisements for the position; post the position in various online venues; gather and vet the applications; interview the short listed candidates (conducted as a larger committee). I am responsible for all contact with applicants and Kobe College.
