Course topics include the historical, cultural, and economic forces implicated in the development and perpetuation of corporate sponsored consumerism in communication.

**Organizational Communication (undergrad. & grad. levels)**

Course topics include meta-theoretical foundations and implications of organizational communication theory. Course draws out their relevances for historical and contemporary organizational practices.

**Critical/Cultural and Interpretive Methods (grad. level & undergraduate)**

Course topics include the theoretical assumptions and methodological practices specific to semiotics, phenomenology, ethnography, ethnomethodology, critical theory, cultural studies, feminist research, and discourse analysis.

**Crisis Communications: 9-11 (undergrad level)**

Course topics include historical and social origins of 9-11, communication practices surrounding the immediate events of 9-11, and media representations of 9-11.

**Communication and Gender (undergraduate classroom based and Internet)**

Course addresses communication construction of gender identities.

**Gender and Organizational Communication**

Focuses on gendered nature of organizational roles, expectations, and communications.

**Power and Conflict in the Organization**

Course topics include the role of political economy in organizational communication and the micro-politics of power in human resource theory and everyday work activities.

**Organizational Culture, Power and Gender**

Course topics include theoretical and pragmatic evaluation of how power and gender relations are instantiated in organizational culture.

**Employee Participation Processes & Organizational Communication**

Course topics include the philosophical foundations of democratic processes as well as their diverse articulations in formal and informal organizational communication practices.

**Rhetorical and Critical Approaches to Public Relations**

Course topics include the historical origins of public relations, current public relations practices, and critical/rhetorical analyses of public relations persuasive campaigns.

**Persuasion**

Course topics include a comprehensive assessment of qualitative and quantitative theories of persuasion.
